The International Union of Socialist Youth (IUSY) expresses its deep concern at the global rise in disinformation, hate speech, and incitement fueled by far-right movements, authoritarian governments, and complicit digital corporations. These forces use lies and racist propaganda to justify oppression, normalize violence, and erode democracy and international law.

Across the world, far-right actors have turned digital platforms into weapons of political manipulation. They incite hatred, scapegoat marginalized communities, spread conspiracies, and mobilize nationalist fear — undermining truth, democratic institutions, and human rights. In the United States, the current administration has revived dangerous policies rooted in white supremacy and Christian nationalism. It has escalated mass deportations, attacked reproductive and LGBTQ+ rights, and dismantled anti-discrimination protections, using disinformation to justify repression and authoritarian control.

In Europe, parties like AfD (Germany) and Vox (Spain) have built influence through xenophobic narratives, anti-migrant disinformation, Islamophobia, and open historical revisionism. These movements gain traction by spreading fear and mistrust — often aided by platform algorithms that reward outrage over truth.

In Israel, the far-right and fascist government has intensified incitement, surveillance, and racialized propaganda. It has used systematic hate speech, digital repression, and mass disinformation campaigns to justify ongoing apartheid policies and to whitewash the war crimes and genocide in Gaza. From senior ministers to official state channels, incitement against Palestinians has become normalized, portraying an entire people as legitimate targets. This coordinated use of misinformation seeks to desensitize global opinion, suppress solidarity movements, and legitimize unprecedented violence, forced displacement, and genocide under the guise of "self-defense."

Meanwhile, tech companies and social media platforms have failed to stop the spread of violent content. Their business models, driven by profit and algorithmic engagement, amplify extremist voices and normalize hate speech. From Facebook to X (formerly Twitter), platforms have reinstated banned extremists, ignored community safety, and offered a global stage to fascists and demagogues. Surveillance capitalism has made hate profitable, while democratic values suffer.

42 Therefore, IUSY:

- 43 • Condemns the systematic use of disinformation and incitement by far-right,
44 authoritarian, and fascist actors worldwide, and the normalization of fascist narratives in
45 public discourse.
- 46 • Denounces the complicity of Big Tech and surveillance capitalism, which enable and
47 profit from online hate and political manipulation.
- 48 • Demands international regulation of digital platforms to ensure algorithmic
49 transparency, enforcement of anti-hate policies, and protection against incitement and
50 state-backed propaganda.
- 51 • Calls for legal accountability for state actors and tech firms when misinformation directly
52 contributes to human rights violations and violent repression.
- 53 • Commits to mobilizing IUSY member organizations to fight far-right digital ecosystems
54 through education, media literacy, international solidarity campaigns, and transnational
55 anti-fascist organizing.
- 56 • Supports coordinated monitoring efforts of far-right networks online, and alliances with
57 civil society, journalists, and democratic movements to resist digital authoritarianism.
