1 Reaffirming its commitment to peace, democracy, and the dignity of peoples, in line with the principles of the  
2 United Nations Charter, the African Union's Agenda 2063, and the relevant UN resolutions (A/RES/70/262,  
3 S/RES/2320),

4 Recognizing that peace cannot be reduced to the absence of war but requires strong political will to address  
5 injustice, inequality, exclusion, neocolonial exploitation, and foreign interference that fuel conflict within the  
6 African peoples,

7 Seriously concerned by the expansion of violent conflicts and political instability across the African continent,  
8 including:

- 10 ●the ongoing war in Sudan, where thousands of civilians have been killed, displaced, or  
trapped in a devastating humanitarian crisis;
  - 11 ●prolonged crises in the Sahel, Horn of Africa, Great Lakes Region, often exacerbated by  
12 climate change, the arms trade, weak institutions, and external manipulation;
  - 13 ●the wave of unconstitutional regime changes (in Burkina Faso, Guinea, Chad, Niger,  
14 Gabon), reflecting not only a breakdown of democratic institutions but also the deep  
15 frustration of African youth over unmet social justice and security demands;
  - 16

17 Affirming that peace in Africa must be rooted in sovereignty, territorial integrity, regional cooperation, and  
18 inclusive political solutions, in accordance with international law and multilateral frameworks,

19 Acknowledging the growing role of African-led diplomacy, South-South cooperation, and civilian mediation  
20 initiatives in building peace and regional security,

21 Emphasizing that African youth are not merely victims of violence but powerful agents of transformation,  
22 capable of reimagining and building alternative pathways to peace rooted in dignity, inclusion, and justice,

23 Therefore, we resolve:

24 1.To express full solidarity with African populations affected by conflict, forced displacement,  
25 militarized politics, and democratic backsliding, and calls for strengthened humanitarian  
26 support and diplomatic engagement in all crisis areas;

28 2.To reject authoritarianism, militarism and opportunistic transitions, and call for sincere  
29 democratic reconstruction in countries facing institutional breakdowns — with youth, women,  
30 and marginalized communities at the core of transition processes;

32 3.To reaffirm the importance of respecting the territorial integrity of African States, and  
33 encourage the political resolution of long-standing disputes through peaceful dialogue,  
34 inclusive negotiation, and relevant UN frameworks — in a spirit of sovereignty, and pan-  
35 African unity;

37 4.To call for robust youth inclusion in peacebuilding efforts, through civic education,

5. To urge international partners to reframe their engagement with Africa through a lens of mutual respect, solidarity, and equitable cooperation — and to move away from extractive or opportunistic relations that weaken African ownership and resilience.
