- 1 Reaffirming IUSY’s commitment to peace, democracy, social justice, and international
- 2 solidarity, rooted in the principles of the United Nations Charter and international law;
  
- 3 Affirming that peace is inseparable from justice, dignity, democratic legitimacy, and
- 4 respect for peoples’ rights and cannot exist where violence, repression, and exclusion
- 5 prevail;
  
- 6 Alarmed by the deepening crises across Africa and the Middle East, where wars,
- 7 forced displacement, and democratic regression continue to devastate civilian
- 8 populations and fracture societies;
  
- 9 Recognizing that these crises are not inevitable but are the result of political choices,
- 10 militarization, foreign interference, and the persistent denial of inclusive and democratic
- 11 solutions;
  
- 12 Expressing its full, and unwavering solidarity with the Palestinian people, who continue
- 13 to endure immense human suffering, destruction, and forced displacement;
  
- 14 Reaffirming the inalienable right of the Palestinian people to self-determination, and
- 15 calling for a just and lasting political solution based on international law and United
- 16 Nations resolutions, including the establishment of an independent Palestinian State on
- 17 the basis of the 1967 borders, with East Jerusalem as its capital;
  
- 18 Deeply alarmed by the war in Sudan, which has torn apart the social fabric of the
- 19 country, displaced millions, and created one of the gravest humanitarian catastrophes
- 20 on the African continent;



- 21 Standing in full solidarity with the Sudanese people and calling for urgent mobilization  
22 by African institutions, the African Union, and the international community to end the  
23 fighting, stop foreign interventions, protect civilians, and support a civilian-led political  
24 process capable of restoring peace, unity, and democratic governance;
- 25 Deeply concerned by the escalation of tensions between the Democratic Republic of  
26 the Congo and Rwanda, which threaten regional stability and undermine the  
27 sovereignty and territorial integrity of the Democratic Republic of the Congo;
- 28 Calling for strict respect of United Nations Security Council Resolution 2773, while  
29 welcoming diplomatic efforts, dialogue initiatives, and confidence-building measures as  
30 necessary steps toward a durable political solution in the Great Lakes region;
- 31 Affirming that lasting peace in Africa and the Middle East must be built on sovereignty,  
32 territorial integrity, democratic legitimacy, and inclusive political solutions;
- 33 Supporting the peaceful resolution of conflicts through dialogue, negotiation, and  
34 relevant United Nations and regional frameworks, including the United Nations-led  
35 political process and United Nations Security Council Resolution 2797 concerning the  
36 Sahara, reaffirming the need for a serious, credible, and realistic basis for a just,  
37 lasting, and mutually acceptable political solution that strengthens regional integration  
38 and shared prosperity;
- 39 Reaffirming the fundamental principle of respect for the sovereignty and territorial  
40 integrity of African States, and rejecting all unilateral secessionist attempts, including  
41 any unilateral steps regarding the status of Somaliland taken outside an inclusive,  
42 nationally-led dialogue, as such processes undermine regional stability, African unity,  
43 and long-term peace, and must be addressed exclusively through recognised  
44 international and regional frameworks;
- 45 Expressing deep concern over the situation in Venezuela, and condemning the  
46 continued violations of the sovereignty of the Venezuelan State through unilateral  
47 coercive measures and external political interference, particularly by the United States,  
48 which undermine democratic processes, exacerbate social suffering, and constitute a  
49 clear expression of imperialist domination;
- 50 Emphasising that youth are not passive victims of war and repression but political  
51 actors and agents of change whose participation is essential to peacebuilding,  
52 democratic transitions, and social justice;



53 Therefore, we resolve to:

54 Stand in solidarity with all peoples in Africa and the Middle East facing war, repression,  
55 and forced displacement, and demand the protection of civilians and the expansion of  
56 humanitarian assistance;

57 Demand immediate, durable, and verifiable ceasefires in all conflict zones, in full  
58 compliance with international humanitarian law;

59 Reject coups d'état, militarism, and unconstitutional seizures of power, and reaffirm that  
60 civilian authority, democratic governance, and popular legitimacy are the only  
61 foundations of sustainable peace;

62 Defend accountability, justice, and reconciliation, including transitional justice  
63 mechanisms and the fight against impunity;

64 Assert the central role of youth and women in peacebuilding, democratic life, and  
65 political decision-making;

66 Call on international actors to engage with Africa and the Middle East on the basis of  
67 international law, sovereignty, and mutual respect and to abandon militarized,  
68 extractive, and opportunistic approaches that perpetuate instability.
